

17 Jewish Family Services Community Garden

Our community garden is a therapeutic and neutral environment in which our refugee clients can find community and positive well being by helping to maintain as well as tend the garden. Our vision for the garden is to bring together Jewish Family Service (JFS) programs, including refugee resettlement, the licensed mental and behavioral health clinic, as well as the WNY Center for Survivors of Torture. With the input of our clients, we have been able to successfully grow a variety of vegetables and flowers. To date, our garden consists of cucumbers, tomatoes, spinach, peppers, carrots and lettuce. We also have Marigolds and Daisies, and different spices such as sage and parsley. Our clients have decided to come weekly, Wednesdays at 10AM, to maintain the upkeep of the garden by watering, weeding and planting new plants that we receive through donations. Their enthusiasm has clearly shined through while building this garden.

16 Richmond Summer Senior Center Garden

Begun in 2014 in partnership with Grassroots Gardens, the City of Buffalo Richmond-Summer Senior Center Gardens are planned and maintained by seniors at the BMHA Sedita Apartments and friends. In 2015, raised beds were added in greenspace off the parking lot for seniors planting vegetables and flowers.

26 First Presbyterian Community Garden

A little history about First Presbyterian Community garden. Our community garden began as the remnants of an old rusty and unusable playground in 2011. We had a rain garden installed in the garden that is fed by the roofs of the church. Our raised and round beds have hosted crops of herbs, perennials and vegetables. This year due to the heavy snow our raised beds were flattened over the course of the winter, so this year we are a herb and flower garden. We hope you will stroll the paths and enjoy our beloved garden.

30 Trinity Tupper Community Garden

Started in 2011, the Trinity Tupper Community Garden is a collectively-run and maintained flower and vegetable community garden in Buffalo. It is sponsored by the VETTE block club. We use organic, environmentally friendly methods, and we don't use any pesticides. Open House: 10-4 Saturday and Sunday
